

Proposal for organising a shared task on

Speaker attribution and coreference resolution in political debates

Task should be useful for many applications:
 => who says / thinks / writes what to whom?

• Speaker attribution annotation scheme based on the Redewiedergabe project (Brunner et al. 2013, 2020)

• Schema:

- -the **medium** (speech, thought, writing)
- -the **type** (*direct, indirect, reported*)
- -the **role** (speaker or source, <u>frame</u>, message, adressee)

Example:

Die Linke sagt: "Lange Arbeitszeiten und fehlende Ruhezeiten machen krank".

- -Medium: speech
- -Type: *direct*

Die Linke sagt: "Lange Arbeitszeiten und fehlende Ruhezeiten machen krank".

Why do we need **coreference resolution**?




[Zu lange Arbeitszeiten machen krank.], Das, behaupten nicht nur die Linken.

How to get going:

- Select data (Bundestag debates, EuroParl?)
- Adapt guidelines from Redewiedergabe project
- Apply for funding at GSCL (won't be enough...)
